The period between 12 and 14 September is relatively busy for hotels located in the centre of Brussels, so we recommend that you extend your search on [Booking.com](https://www.booking.com).

Please take into consideration that the area around Midi station is not really tourist friendly. We recommend you get a hotel in the central part of Brussels, you can easily get to the Pullman Brussels Centre Midi via metro 2 and 6, or pre-metro 3 and 4.

 **From the airport to the meeting venue****Train**

We recommend that you take the train from the airport to the central station. The journey takes around 20-30 minutes. From most Belgian train stations you can easily travel to and from Brussels Airport, with a direct connection or a change of trains.

To check train connections to Brussels Airport, enter your departure station and the destination Brussels Airport-Zaventem in the online journey planner. Your train will arrive at the basement level at the heart of the airport. Escalators and elevators will take you directly from the airport's departure hall and the airline companies' check-in desks to the city centre.

Taxi

Enter the car in front of the arrivals hall. The airport taxi driver will take you to your destination:

- No need to book in advance.
- An official airport taxi will take you directly to your destination.
