# The Planning poker technique or Scrum Poker

- Planning poker technique is used in project planning to assess the difficulty of a series of tasks or situations
  - Each player receives a deck of card (1 – 3 – 5 – 8 – 10 – 13 – 20), each card corresponds to a level of difficulty.
  - A challenging situation is exposed. Using the cards, players evaluate by themselves how challenging the situation is.
  - At the same time, players reveal their choice.

# The Planning poker technique or Scrum Poker

- It trully begins once the votes are revealed

Now, we want the players justify their position, especially, those who separate from the crowd

PI 1	PI 2	PI 3	PI 4	PI 5	PI 6	PI 7	PI 8
8	5	5	3	5	5	8	5

Those players are asked to justify their vote : why is the situation more/less difficult ? Do they feel that there is something other players missed ? Etc...

All players can speak: there are NO good or wrong answers

# The Planning poker technique or Scrum Poker

- Eventually, another vote happens

Player may or may not change their vote, including those who had the most common vote

# The Planning poker technique or Scrum Poker

- **The point is to keep the discussion going on**

Several votes may happen for each situation. What we want is to get your input on the challenges of Prevent PCP.

The objective is to reach one of these two situations:

1. Players reach a consensus
2. Players agree on their disagreement but have the feeling that their position has been heard

To break the ice: we start with an easy situation
